






Enjoy an eclectic set of classical music with rising stars soprano, Kelley Lonergan, and percussion-

Debride is an exhibition of new artwork by local artist, Brigid Teehan, that examine tensions and fragilities surrounding private/public bodies. The show's title "Debride" is a verb meaning "to remove damaged tissue from a wound." It has its origins in 1839, from French debridement, literally "an unbridling," from débrider "to unbridle," meaning the removal of the headpiece of a horse's harness used to govern and restrain the animal.

Also look out for new artwork on display at Beehouse Arts by guest mixed-media artist, Ian Mannion.


